

The Flying Canoe

Dear Parents,

Rag & Bone Puppet Theatre is glad that your child is going to be a part of The Flying Canoe at Shenkman Arts Centre! Here's some information.

Please drop your child off one hour before the show:

- Come to the Richcraft Theatre of Shenkman Arts Centre (245 Centrum Blvd, Orléans). The theatre is downstairs. There will be a Rag & Bone table in the lobby downstairs where parents can drop off choir members and pick up or buy tickets. Box office will open 45 minutes before the show.
- A Rag & Bone member will take students and teachers to the dressing room to drop off coats etc. There will be a short rehearsal on the stage, then they will go back to the dressing room until show time. After the audience is in place, the students will file in and sit on risers on the stage. They will watch the show from the risers, and stand up to sing three songs—at the beginning, middle and end of the performance.

Meet/pick up your child after the show—(one hour after the start):

The students will come back to the lobby outside the Studio Theatre.

Things to remember:

- Choir clothes. Children should either wear them or bring them.
- Indoor shoes.
- Leave everything else at home (toys, books or valuables). They might get lost or stolen.
- No food will be served. Children should eat before they come.
- Please, no cell phones or cameras during the show. After the final song, the children will pose for photos. They will then go backstage, get their coats from the dressing room, and meet you in the lobby.
- Let us know if you need any accommodations, like wheelchair seating for grandparents.
- And enjoy the show! !
